We can no longer live in a world that does not respect the rights of women and children.

In closing, please remember one thing: Malala Day is not my day. Today is the day for every woman, every boy and every girl who are fighting for their rights.

Hello, my name is Frendie, a \*childcare robot working at a \*nursery school.

When the day begins, I say, "Good morning, Hiroshi." When the parents come to pick up their child, I say, "See you tomorrow, Naomi." Of course, that's not all. I can do many things to help \*childcare workers because I have \*AI inside me.

Every day, when I meet children, I watch each child with my camera-eyes and record the time of their arrival and \*pick-up. I give the human staff and their parents a lot of useful information: How long did each child stay in the nursery school? How well did each child sleep after lunch? How is each child's condition?

While they are playing in the garden, or having lunch in the room, I always stay with them and watch them. If something bad happens to them, I will contact the human staff \*immediately. Sometimes I can call the parents to ask them to pick up their child.

Also I can do more things. I can help the human staff to make plans for \*childcare education and \*run the \*daycare center. I can make the lunch menu for each child. Many children have \*allergies to some foods. I carefully choose food for each child and make healthy menus for the children.

I want each child to learn as much as possible. One of the most important things I can do is to teach how to read and write. I have good educational programs in my AI, so I can make many kinds of study drills; for example, *hiragana* or *kanji* drills or \*calculation drills. I can wait until each child finishes one drill, and then give them another drill. While I'm teaching them, the human staff can do other things for the children.

\*Unfortunately, I cannot play with children as well as the human staff can: go for a walk with children, play in the garden and dance with children. Instead, I can do many things that the human staff cannot do. Of course, there are things that the human staff must do. (\*\*\(\beta\)) In the future it will become more and more necessary for humans and robots to work together.

Now I have a dream. If AI robots \*evolve more, robots can do more things. ( $\lor \lor$ ) What do you want us to do in the future?
